

PROVISIONAL TIMETABLE OF EVENTS MGP RALLY 2010.

Saturday 28th August.

Old Laxey Harbour. Sign on from 10.00am for 12.00am start.
Machines to be displayed along Promenade.
Social run

Sunday 29th August.

Festival of Jurby. Signing on from 9.30am. First track session at 10.15am.
Machines will be segregated into similar years and performance. Machines need not be road legal but must be fit for purpose. Riding numbers must be displayed. A full driving licence must be shown when signing on, no learner riders will be accepted.
IMPORTANT. This is not a race. Anyone failing to enter into the spirit of the event WILL be black flagged. More Caterers than in 2009 will be on site, and the public will be encouraged to mingle with the machines. Be aware at all times of others, and ride safely. Each Parade will be of approx. 10 minutes duration. Hopefully there will be time for at least two parades per person.

A meeting of riders who are parading in the Closed Roads Parade on the Monday will be held at Jurby in one of the Marquees [which will have a VMCC Banner displayed]. The time of this meeting will be advised when final Regulations are sent out. **ANYONE WHO DOES NOT ATTEND THIS BRIEFING AND DOES NOT SIGN ON WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO ENTER THE CLOSED ROADS PARADE.** You will also be given a wrist band that **MUST** be worn on the Parade. A new P.A. System will be used by the Clerk of the Course.

Monday 30th August.

Quarterbridge to Grandstand Closed Road Parade.

ONLY ENTRANTS CORRECTLY SIGNED ON AND WHO HAVE ATTENDED THE SAFETY BRIEFING AT JURBY WILL BE ALLOWED TO PARADE.

Insurance, driving license and vehicle tax will be inspected as well as wrist band. If these items and documents are not shown the rider will not be allowed to parade.

Persons under the age of 18 years, motorcycle sidecar combinations, other three wheeled machines and passengers on solo machines are not permitted to take part in the closed road parade under ACU regulations ACU PR5. Riders over the age of 70 are permitted to take part in the parade, only after producing a fitness certificate/letter signed by their doctor stating they are fit to do so, at the time of signing on for the Parade.

No loose luggage, what so ever, is permitted on machines during the parade, and should be deposited with the organisers for transportation to the Grandstand. Riding clothes must be leather or stout material i.e. Belstaff. Entrants wearing jeans or normal trousers **MUST** wear stout over-trousers. **NO BARE FLESH.** Motorcycle or similar strong boots must be

worn. No shoes or trainers, and riders must wear approved helmets. These are either “Jet” style open faced or full face style. REMEMBER NO PUDDING BASINS.

These instructions must be adhered to and no exceptions can be made.

BBQ to be held at A.R.E. Classic Bike Museum, Kirk Michael at 5.30pm.

Tuesday 31st August.

Assemble and sign on at Port Erin 10.00am for 11.00am start. 60 mile social run, with a stop for lunch, culminating in Castletown Square at 5.00pm for display of machines, musical entertainment and catering van on site.

Wednesday 1st September.

Fall back for Closed Roads Parade, in the event of Monday’s event being cancelled due to weather or racing timetable being changed. Requirements as per Monday’s instructions.

Thursday 2nd September.

Assemble Mooragh Park, Ramsey sign on from 9.30am for 11.00am start. This will be a timed event with checkpoints on route, finishing back at Ramsey for a display of machines and Concourse. Lunch will be provided. Afternoon free to watch Ramsey Sprint.

Gala Dinner and Prize Presentation.

The Royal Hall, Villa Marina, Douglas Sea Front.

For those who have purchased tickets for the Dinner, doors open at 7.30pm for a prompt 8.00pm start. Dinner tickets MUST be produced.

Anyone not wishing to pay for the Gala Dinner but still wishing to come to the Prize Presentation should arrive at 9.30pm. A pay bar will be available.
